FSA Beef Program: CFAP:

Below provides a short run down on the CFAP AND LFP program and the information that you will need in order to get your applications started:

The CFAP program has two sections for livestock, one that provides assistance for livestock sold between January 15 – April 14, 2020. For sold livestock listed in the following format:

- Feeder Cattle (<600 lbs.)
- Feeder Cattle (> 600 lbs.)
- Slaughter Cattle: Fed Cattle
- Slaughter Cattle: Mature Cattle
- All Other Cattle (not including livestock used, or intended for, dairy production).

The second part of the program provides assistance for livestock on hand between April 15 and May 14, 2020. You will need the cattle numbers in the same format as shown above. Below is price per head that producers will receive, the first numbers are for sold livestock the second number is for livestock on hand. When the County Office makes payment the producer will receive 80% of their projected payment. I believe the remainder 20% will be paid at the end of signup.

Cattle:

Feeder Cattle: Less than 600 Pounds/Head \$102.00 --- \$33.00

Feeder Cattle: 600 Pounds or More/Head \$139.00 --- \$33.00

Slaughter Cattle: Fed Cattle/Head \$214.00 --- \$33.00

Slaughter Cattle: Mature Cattle/Head \$92.00 --- \$33.00

All Other Cattle

Head \$102.00 --- \$33.00

There is also the Livestock Forage Program (LFP). This program follows the US Drought Monitor. Humboldt County fell into a Drought- D3 as April 21, 2020. To get you signed up for this program you will need the following:

BRIANNA RIMMEY - 1st Alt Dairy Princess

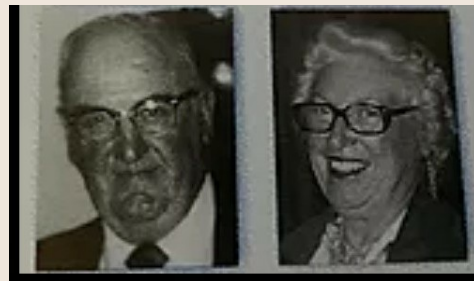
CADENCE LOMMORI - 2nd Alt Dairy Princess.

Farm Bureau Awards over \$91,000 in Scholarships:



Over \$91,000 was awarded to 53 graduating seniors and continuing college students by the Humboldt County Farm Bureau. These Scholarships were awarded to students that major or minor in Agriculture, Science, Education, or Vocational Education and are attending an accredited Jr. College, four-year College, or Vocational School. The scholarships awarded are the ***Henri and Lanette Rousseau Memorial Scholarship, Sterling F. Paddock Memorial Scholarship, Ike Moxon Memorial Scholarship, Gene Whitney Production Forestry Scholarship, Humboldt County Wool Growers Scholarship, Harry & Nadine McWhorter Memorial Scholarship and Humboldt County FARM FUND Scholarship.*** Students may reapply for the Farm Bureau scholarships for a total of four years.

The Henri and Lanette Rousseau Memorial Scholarship was established by the late Lanette Rousseau to provide educational opportunities for graduates from Humboldt County High Schools to pursue a field of Agriculture, Science, Education or Vocational Education.

Henri and Lanette Rousseau were life long members of the Farm Bureau and both were active on the Board of Directors. In 1996, the Rousseau Estate provided a partnership between the Humboldt Area Foundation and the Humboldt County Farm Bureau for this scholarship program.

Many people on the north coast frequent our local Farmers Markets weekly for fresh locally grown produce. With the onset of COVID-19, high risk consumers no longer have that option. North Coast Growers Association recognized the need to develop a way to continue making fresh produce available to those customers. With help from Humboldt Area Foundation's Regional COVID-19 Response Fund and Lost Coast Brewery the Association, the NCGA is now offering the **Harvest Box** program.

Each box costs \$20 and contains a variety of produce grown locally by our Humboldt County farmers. Boxes with pre-selected items, depending on seasonality and availability, so are they are not able to be customized. NCGA's aim is to include items that allow for the most nutrient and flavor variety. The boxes are available as a drive-up service to minimize human exposure. The number of boxes is limited, and will be available on a first paid first serve basis. They hope to expand the number of boxes available as this program continues. Boxes are ordered on a weekly schedule.
